1)What was Beringia?

Beringia is a geographic description of a vast area of water between the Kolyma river. Once used by S.Sushkin and E.Hulten between the 1920's and 1930's.

2)When was the last ice age and what significant event happened during it?

The last ice age ended over 10,000. During the ice age vast ice sheets up to nearly two miles thick burdened much of America. Because of the water on the earth's hydrosphere is constant, the ice sheets hoarding the global waters caused sea levels to drop.

3)What evidence is there to support the Land Bridge theory?

During the time of the land bridge a sea level dropped 300 hundred feet during the Wisconsin glacial period revealed a relatively flat, low-lying stretch of continental plain linking North America to Asia.
